**Vote-by-Mail Ballots to be Mailed on February 11, 2020**

Vote-by-Mail ballots will be sent out to 29,355 registered Hernando County voters on Tuesday, February 11, 2020 for the March 17<sup>th</sup>, Presidential Preference Primary.

According to state law, only registered Democrats and Republicans are eligible to vote in the Presidential Preference Primary. Only those voters who requested mail ballots will receive them in the first mail out. Additional requests can still be sent to the Supervisor of Election's website [www.hernandovotes.com](http://www.hernandovotes.com) or by calling 352-754-4125. The deadline to request a mail ballot is Saturday, March 7, 2020 at 5 p.m.

Ballots must be returned via USPS or hand delivered to one of the Supervisor of Elections offices by 7 p.m. on Election Day. For those cutting it too close for traditional mail with the USPS, the ballots can be physically dropped off at either office.
